COMMITTEE AND DEPARTMENT HEAD REPORTS

Councilman Macko reported that Assessor, Jeneen McSkimming, has requested to attending the NYS Assessors Association Annual Seminar & Assessment Administration and Executive Board Session in Lake George on September 18th thru the 21st, 2016. As a member of the Executive Board all expenses are paid by the NYS Assessor's Association.

-New Flag Dedication Ceremony at the Sturgeon Point Marina on September 12th at 7pm. American Legion Color Guard will be dedicating a new 5ft by 7ft flag and thank you to the Sturgeon Point Advisory Board for setting this up.

Supervisor Hosler reported on the following:

- National Grid was contacted about a deflector for the street light at the corner of Sandy and Patton and Fulton as it is shining into a 2nd floor window. The Chief of Police was also contacted to see about the possibility of having the light moved.
- National Grid and Police Department were contacted about the street light at the corner of Grove and Fulton as a resident was complaining
- *Roberta Rappoccio, Planning Director has been working on about 10 grants
- *Box Culvert on Derby Rd 100%
- * Ahler's Bridge for replacement 90% paid project from the Army Corp of Engineers,
- *received notification for a grant award for the Town Clerk for fire proofing the basement of Town Hall for \$142,000
- *received \$172,000 for the Town Park for bio-swales for the rain and gardens for the addition of filtration of the rain for Fernbrook to assist in the prevention of beach closings
- *awarded \$75,000 with an additional \$20,000 Zombie Grant for Zombie Properties
- *Applied for a \$300,000 Restore NY Grant
- attended a conference today with Governor Cuomo for sustainable development and

one of the breakout sessions was pertaining to Zombie Properties and Land Banking (15 properties are slated to demolished this year to help with the Zombie Property situation.)

-if the these grants are awarded the financial burden with not fall on the back of Erie County Taxpayers which is us.

-the Town has spent close to a \$1,000,000 on property maintenance last year as 107 properties were maintained last year. For this year it has been cut down to 32 propeties and only \$8,000 has been spent so far. We a Code Enforcement Officer who is just handling Property Maintenance Law violations from violation to citation to appearance ticket to fine to potentially 15 days in jail. This Town Board is taking it seriously so that there isn't any blight but improvements.

-She has been working with the Army Corp of Engineers, Chris Collins's Office and Councilman Feldmann was present to look at technical support and the Town is in contract with the Army Corp of Engineers since the construction of the Marina and the Army Corp is supposed to pay a % of the maintenance and dredging costs and there has not been a payment since 2005. There is a hole in the wall which is causing a great influx of sand coming into the marina. Chris Collin's Office has been very instrumental in the technical assistance as to how the marina could be enlarged and/or fixing it. According to Chris Collin's Office Evans is the only municipality to have a contract that commits to financial assistance.
